### **Ordinary Meeting**

Attending: David Evans. Development Officer, Westmorland Dales Hidden Landscapes Project. 1 member of the public.

- 060/17 The Chairman was authorised to sign the **minutes** of the ordinary meeting held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> October as a true record subject to minor changes.
- 061/17 **Public Participation.** The swings in Crosby Ravensworth had a rusted footing. The clerk would mark them off with hazard tape and arrange for them to be inspected/repaired.
- Westmorland Dales 'Hidden Landscapes' Heritage Project. A presentation was given by David Evans of the Friends of the Lake District. The wide scope of the project across 21 projects was noted as was the fact that the structure of the project(s) seemed to have been pre-determined. The partnership FOLD/YDNP was looking for ideas to help populate the projects. David Evans would forward details of an event in Orton. Ideas included: The restoration of old signage, Village Atlases, Monuments at Risk. It was agreed that this would be an item on the next agenda and members were asked to come to the next meeting with suggestions for inclusion and feedback.

Footpath Project. Cllr Holroyd gave a brief presentation to introduce the application form to the YDNP Sustainable Development Fund (SDF) to be made by the Parish Council. The application was approved for submission on the basis that the PC would be the accountable body. The project had a value of £8,700 funded as follows: Funding in Kind (Volunteers) £2,750 and £5,950 SDF. Costs shown did not include VATwhich the council could recover. The project would produce interpretive signs for Crosby Ravensworth and Maulds Meaburn and a leaflet featuring six local walks. It was anticipated that by the time of publication the bridleways and footpaths identified would have had the necessary practical works carried out by the YDNP.

# 064/17 Planning YDNP E/03/20 Rooks Quarry, Orton

Section 73 application in respect of conditions 1 and 2 of planning permission 3/07/9003 dated 21 September 2007, to extend the time period for a further 10 years to allow the remaining currently permitted reserves of limestone to be extracted and the progressive restoration of the quarry. The application was actively supported because of the appropriate small scale of operation, the benefits of local employment and good quality local stone for building purposes. The PC was unclear as to why the application had been submitted to YDNP when Cumbria County Council usually dealt with minerals/quarrying and asked for clarification.

### 065/17 Planning EDC 17/0845 WHITEFOLD FARM REAGILL PENRITH CA10 3ER

Outline application for the erection of one dwelling with existing access. Eden District Council had resolved to stop sending out plans. It was not known if there had been any consultation on this and it was felt that applicants should be asked to supply the paperwork to councils as without images before the meeting discussion and understanding were limited. It was agreed that in future the plans would be downloaded and projected at the meeting. It was noted that this was an outline consent on that basis it was supported. The council would fully consider the contemporary design at planning stage.

### 066/17 Highways

CCC would be asked not to carry out repairs to Back Road, Maulds Meaburn until Electricity North West had installed an electrical supply to the barn conversion at Bay Horse.

It was noted that repeated reports to the faults reporting service regarding the 'Animals in the Road' signs along the B6260 had not resulted in their repair. Councillor Hewitt to provide call references to allow formal chasing of the issue

The compaction of the verges along Haberwain Lane to Wickerslack arising from muck spreading from the road had created a significant hazard to other road users. It was questioned whether this practice (muck spreading from the highway) was permitted.

The persistent muddiness along the Winter Tarn road was also raised as a risk to road users and also required control.

#### 067/17 Footway Lighting

The Chairman presented his own paper. A question was raised as to why lighting at Pinfold Cottage had been included in Eden's report when the PC's consultation had asked for it to be removed and the issue of the lighting at Heron View Maulds Meaburn was also discussed. It was agreed that the council would place an item in the link seeking parishioners' views before the next meeting.

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### 068/17 Extension of Meeting at 9:30pm

It was resolved to extend the meeting for a further hour to complete the agenda.

### 069/17 Emergency Planning.

The Chairman presented a brief report of progress and it was resolved that a small subgroup would take the project forward. The group would consist of Cllrs. Graham, Raine and Robinson.

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### 070/17 Council Policies.

The council adopted the draft Freedom of Information Policy, and Data Protection Policy. It was agreed to consult with the YDNP and EDC on the draft Trees policy and take this back to the next meeting with the benefit of their input.
